

## **Curriculum Vita – Service to The George Washington University**

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### **SERVICE TO THE GEORGE WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY (GW) – Summary**

I have been providing service and contributing to GW appropriately. I am serving as Director, Project Management Program (2005–Present), and as a member of GW’s Academic Integrity Council (2004–Present). I served on GW’s Faculty Senate Student Grievance Committee (2002–2003), as co-coordinator of the United Way Campaign for GW’s School of Business and Public Management (2002–2003), as member of the Planning Committee for the Annual Retreat of the Department of Management Science (2001–2002), and as Faculty Advisor to the GW PMI® Student Chapter (2000–2001).

I participated actively with other faculty members in the screening and interview process of potential faculty members in the graduate program on project management. I served as mentor-colleague for new faculty members who joined GW’s PM Program. I participated in the information and orientation sessions conducted for potential and new students and provided guidance in planning their study program. I provided guidance and supported the professional growth of visiting international scholars interested in Project Management as part of the Junior Faculty Development Program. My professional activities are consistent with my interests and with GW’s mission.

### **Specific Service Activities**

Serve as Director, Project Management Program, Department of Management Science, School of Business, GW (July 2005–Present).

Serve as Member of GW’s Academic Integrity Council (2004–Present).

Led and supported the efforts to establish an annual award to recognize and encourage excellence among graduate students in project management at GW. The recipient of this award is selected by GW’s project management faculty based on excellent academic performance and research, as well as service to the program, the university, and the profession. This award was presented for the first time in May 2005.

Led and supported the efforts to establish an agreement with the Graduate School of Management in Lille, France (ESC Lille) to encourage student and faculty exchange, joint scholarly research, and cooperation between the two schools. Memorandum of Understanding was approved by both GW and ESC Lille (2005).

Served as editor of ten case studies in project management, along with appropriate teaching notes for each case. These cases were written by GWSB graduating students in GW's MSPM program with the supervision of GW Professors. The Project Management Institute is publishing these case studies individually (2004–2005).

Hosted Prof. Darren Dalcher, Academic Director, National Centre for Project Management, Middlesex University, London, UK. Prof. Dalcher met with GW faculty members and presented at my project management class (2005).

Hosted Prof. Lynn Crawford, Past Associate Dean of Undergraduate Studies, University of Technology of Sydney, Australia, and Visiting Professor, ESC Lille. Prof. Crawford met with GW leadership and faculty (2005).

Hosted international project management scholars Prof. Brian Hobbs, Prof. Rodney Turner, Prof. Vladimir Voropajev, Prof. Terry Williams, and other guests. The international scholars met with GW leadership and faculty (2003).

Hosted leaders of the Project Management Institute (PMI®): CEO Greg Balastrero, Accreditation Manager Dr. Mike Price, and Research Manager Dr. Harry Stefanou. PMI® leaders met with GW leadership and faculty (2003–2004).

Presented a review session to prepare GW students for the Project Management Professional Certification Examination. This effort was organized by the GW Project Management Student Association and was conducted on two Saturdays in April and May 2005.

Serve as Member of GW Faculty Senate's Student Grievance Committee (2002–2003).

Co-coordinator of the United Way Campaign for GW's School of Business, 2002–2003.

Participated actively with other faculty members in the screening and interview process of potential faculty members in the graduate program on project management.

Served as mentor-colleague for new faculty members.
